System connections

Make sure to unplug the AC/DC adaptor before making any connections.

Connecting iPod or iPhone to TV

Video files from iPod or iPhone can be viewed by connecting the system to TV/monitor.

If the TV/monitor has a video input, connect it to the VIDEO OUT lack at the back of the unit and set the TV Out on the iPod unit to "ON" position.



Watching videos on a TV connected to iPod

- Press the FUNCTION button on the main unit or remote control to select the iPod function
- 2 Enter the iPod or iPhone menu.

Press and hold DISP(TV OUT) button on the remote control or ALARM 1 (DISPLAY) button on the main unit until ON appear on the display.



AC/DC adaptor connection

- Plug the AC/DC adaptor cable into the DC IN lack on the unit.



General control



■ To turn the power on

Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on. The first time power is supplied to the unit, the clock will be blinking on the display. Please set the time and date (refer page 15).

After use:

Press and hold the ON/STAND-BY button to enter the power stand-by mode.

General control (continued)

■ Display brightness control (DIMMER)

Press the SNOOZE/DIMMER button to adjust the brightness of LCD display.



Note:

- Setting dimmer to display in the brightest mode during battery operation will affect battery life.
- During battery operations in standby mode, the brightness of display will automatically go to the lowest mode (dim OFF) after 5 seconds.

Volume auto set in

If you turn off and on the main unit with the volume set to 17 or higher, the volume starts at 16.

■ Volume control

Main unit operation:

Rotate the Volume knob anti-clockwise to decrease volume and clockwise to increase volume.

Remote control operation:

Press the VOLUME (+ or -) button to increase or decrease the volume. Volume indicator will be blinking when the volume reaches maximum or minimum level.

Muting






Setting the time and date

Press the (\vee or \wedge) button once to advance the time by 1 hour. Hold it down to advance continuously. "AM" or "PM" indicator will interchange after each 12 hour cyclic.

Press the $(\lor or \land)$ button once to advance the time by 1 minute. Hold it down for about 5 seconds to change the time in 5-minutes interval







Listening to USB mass storage device/SD Card



- 2 Press the FUNCTION button repeatedly to select the Tuner function.

Listening to the radio (continued)

3 Tune to the desired station.

Main Unit

Manual tuning:

Rotate the TUNING (\vee or \wedge) knob clockwise or counter clockwise to tune into the desired station.

Remote Control

Manual tuning:

Press the TUNING (\vee or \wedge) button as many times as required to tune in to the desired station.

Auto tuning (remote control only):

When the TUNING (\bigvee or \bigwedge) button is pressed for more than 0.5 seconds, scanning will start automatically and the tuner will stop at the first receivable broadcast station.

Notes:

- When radio interference occurs, auto scan tuning may stop automatically at that point.
- Auto scan tuning will skip weak signal stations.
- To stop the auto tuning, press the TUNING (∨ or ∧) button again.

Receiving an FM stereo transmission:

 If the FM reception is weak, the reception will auto changes to monaural, and the sound becomes clearer.

Programming a station

You can store 20 FM stations in memory and recall them at the push of a button. (Preset tuning)

- Perform steps 1 3 in "Tuning" on pages 20 21.
- 2 Press the CLOCK/MEMORY button for more than 2 seconds on the main unit or remote control to enter the preset tuning saving mode.



3 Within 7 seconds, press the I of I button on the main unit or V or ∧ button on the remote control to select the preset channel number.

Store the stations in memory, in order, starting with preset channel 1.

■ To recall a programmed station

Wake up source:

Alarm icon "0" will light up to indicate alarm setting.

If wake up source is set to iPod, and iPod is not present, the alarm source will change to default Buzzer.

Activate and deactivate the alarm

- 1 Press ALARM 1 or ALARM 2 button once to deactivate current alarm times and wake up source.







■ Condensation

Sudden temperature changes, storage or operation in an extremely humid environment may cause condensation inside the cabinet or on the transmitter on the remote control.

Condensation can cause the unit to malfunction. If this happens, leave the power on until normal playback is possible (about 1 hour). Wipe off any condensation on the transmitter with a soft cloth before operating the unit.

If problem occurs




